Greetings! I am writing to request your support on behalf of the Presbytery for a fledgling affiliate of the Industrial Areas Foundation (IAF), the Little Rock Organizing Committee, as we pursue a Congregational Based Community Organizing start up grant from the Presbyterian Hunger Program of the Presbyterian Mission Agency. This grant requires a letter of support from the Presbytery of origin within its online application.

The IAF is a national teaching and training institute that works with member affiliates to offer the necessary tools to organize responsively to the needs of the families they serve. It is a large network of local (city-wide) organizations, with over 60 affiliates around the US. Each organization stems from local efforts, and is controlled by the members of that local organization. All IAF organizations are non-partisan and never tackle issues that violate any of the member-congregation's faith traditions.

The LROC is committed to bringing together a diverse group of interfaith congregations and civic organizations from the greater Little Rock area, to develop their shared voice through intentional listening in "house meetings" and successively larger sessions, to discern key local issues of social justice, quality of life and access to resources, and to strategically respond to these needs through organized actions. Relationship-building and congregational renewal are key to each organization's development. IAF affiliates typically use creative methods of public accountability to make structural changes on their issues.

Two of our local Presbyterian congregations, First Presbyterian Church of Little Rock and First Presbyterian Argenta/North Little Rock, have already submitted start-up funding of \$700 and \$500 respectively, as well as committed to leadership development and house meetings. Other local Presbyterian congregations are also discerning their role, and would join several organizations that have already confirmed their involvement: the Catholic Diocese of Little Rock, the Episcopal Diocese of Arkansas, the Unitarian Universalist Church of Little Rock and Wellspring Renewal Center. LROC is also in active conversation with the Muslim community as well as several African American churches of various denominations and a large local Pentecostal church as we continue to cast a wide net for our organizing efforts.

We ask that you please vote "aye" to encourage our efforts to gain additional start-up funding with a letter of support from Arkansas Presbytery to the Presbyterian Hunger Program for their CBCO start up grant. Included as an attachment is a sample letter for your convenience. If supportive, please send a signed copy on letterhead to organizer Alaa Eldamaty (alaaeldamaty@gmail.com), for inclusion in the online application due June 29th.

The General Committee of the Presbytery of Arkansas met at First Presbyterian Church, Conway, Arkansas on Saturday, April 18, 2015. It adopted the following motions and actions:

- 1. Motion to affirm the Administrative Commission for Walnut Grove and Cane Hill; consisting of Phil Butin, Charles Cook, Marie Mainard O'Connell, Ted Belden, and John King. PASSED.
- 2. Motion to accept the recommendation of the Mission Committee that the offering to be received at the 129th Stated Meeting be designated for the Journey Into Hope mission in Dominica. (A mission which is an outgrowth of the work of Faith Presbyterian Church of Horseshoe Bend.)
- 3. Motion to approve an Administrative Commission for Ozark, consisting of TE Dari Rowen, RE Cindy Lanphear, and two members to be named by CC&D, and either TE Robert Lowry or TE Brian Brock. PASSED.

(requiring a simple majority to pass and another vote by a majority at the 130th Stated Meeting (October 9-10, 2015) to take effect. PASSED.
- 7. Report of the Stated Clerk Search Committee

Search Committee Members: Steve Hancock (Moderator), Georgia Senor (Clerk), Bill Bailey, Dick

Our committee was charged with the responsibility of nominating a candidate to fill the unexpired term (class of 2016) of Stated Clerk of the Presbytery of Arkansas. The normal term for Stated Clerk is three years. This unexpired term has a year and a half left.

In fulfillment of our responsibility:

- 1. We recommend the updated job description (attached) for the Stated Clerk be approved by the presbytery.
- 2. We nominate Robert Lowry to fill the unexpired term of Stated Clerk for the Presbytery of Arkansas.
- 3. We recommend the following compensation:

Annual salary of \$16,000

Annual Board of Pension dues of \$5840

Continuing Education and Travel Expenses – up to \$4300 per year

Auto travel reimbursed at the IRS employee mileage reimbursement rate of 57.5 cents
per mile. Other travel (airfare, lodging, meals, etc.) reimbursed from receipts.

- 4. We recommend a start date of July 1, 2015
- 5. We recommend the Stated Clerk Search Committee be dissolved.

Job Description Stated Clerk of the Presbytery of Arkansas

(Proposed updates are in italics)

The Stated Clerk shall be a *Teaching Elder or a Ruling Elder* and shall be enrolled as a member of Presbytery. The Stated Clerk shall function in accordance with the <u>Book of Order(</u>G-9.0203).

- 1) Duties related to Stated Clerk's training/continuing education:
- Attend denominational annual polity conference.
- Attend General Assembly meeting at least once during Stated Clerk's three-year term.
- Maintain membership in the Stated Clerks' Association.

2) Duties related to training of others:

- Train Permanent Judicial Commission as needed.
- Train administrative commissions assigned to churches as needed.
- Facilitate the training of new General Assembly (GA) commissioners with General Presbyter and possibly former GA commissioners.
- Work with the current GA commissioners as the polity task force to advise Presbytery on votes on the proposed constitutional amendments.
- In cooperation with the Christian Education and Nurture (CE&N) Committee, arrange annual training
 of clerks of session.
- Train the cluster records review teams prior to the June Presbytery meeting each year.

3) Duties related to legal signatory:

- Serve as one of the elected signers of legal documents for the Presbytery, along with the Moderator of Presbytery and the General Presbyter.
- Certify personal information forms from church professionals with Church Leadership Connection.

4) Duties related to staffing:

- Serve as staff resource to Permanent Judicial Commission.
- In consultation with the Moderator of Presbytery and the Moderator of the Committee on Ministry (COM), appoint and train an Investigating Committee when an accusation has been filed.
- In consultation with the Moderator of COM and the General Presbyter, define the scope of duties, the goals and name the members of an Administrative Commission to address issues in churches. (Manual of Operations C-57)
- Communicate with the moderator of the Committee on Ministry (COM) prior to each stated COM meeting, participate in the annual COM training retreat and may attend COM meetings, if necessary.
- Serve as a member of the Presbytery Crisis Response Team. (appendix M Manual of Operations)
- Serve as staff resource to the Committee on Preparation for Ministry.
- Serve as staff resource for Presbyterian Women.

5) Duties related to polity:

 Make polity rulings and do polity interpretations for churches, leaders, committees, boards and councils of the Presbytery, in dialogue with the PC (USA) Stated Clerk and the Office of the General Assembly, when necessary.

6) Duties related to communications:

- Receive requests and communications from governing bodies, churches and individuals and as appropriate, refer them to committees of Presbytery or the Presbytery as a whole.
- Possess and use appropriate technological skills
- Maintain, publicize and adhere to set "office hours" during which the Presbytery may contact the Stated Clerk
- Regularly participate in presbytery staff meetings and at least monthly update the General Presbyter and Assistant Stated Clerk on work completed and work pending related to the job description.

- 7) Duties related to Presbytery meetings:
- Act as parliamentarian for all meetings of the Presbytery, assisting the Moderator in the orderly conduct of the business of the governing body.
- Work with the Moderator of Presbytery to perform the duties of the "presbytery meeting task force" for any special called meeting of presbytery. (Manual of Operations III)
- Coordinate with the Assistant Stated Clerk the responsibilities for staff resource for the presbytery meeting task force.(Manual of Operations III)
- Work with Moderator of Presbytery and Assistant Stated Clerk in preparing the Presbytery meeting packet and proposed docket.
- 8) Duties related to General Assembly:
- Sign, as needed, any reports required of the Presbytery by the General Assembly that the Assistant Stated Clerk may prepare.
- Receive and report, as appropriate, all correspondence from the PC (USA) Stated Clerk and the Office
 of the General Assembly.
- Assist Churches in their statistical report to the General Assembly.
- 9) Duties related to record keeping:
- Maintain on the premise and provide to the Presbytery office of all the actions of Presbytery, commissions and Stated Clerk.
- 10) Supervise work of the Assistant Stated Clerk.
- With the General Presbyter and the Personnel sub-committee, participate in the annual evaluation of the Assistant Stated Clerk. (Manual of Operations, Appendix C-6).
- 11) Perform other duties as needed for Presbytery to abide by the Book of Order, <u>Standing Rules</u> and <u>Manual of Operations</u>.
- 12) Accountability and evaluation of the Stated Clerk shall be in accordance with the Presbytery's Standing Rules. The Stated Clerk shall report to the General Presbyter and Personnel Subcommittee.

Motion Before the Presbytery

1. Motion to grant the status of Honorable Retirement to TE Rita Wilson, and to approve the dissolution of call of TE Rita Wilson as Pastor of First Presbyterian Church of Yellville, effective May 31, 2015. TE Burle Mattingly, HR, will speak on behalf of TE Rita Wilson.

Information needed for motions in the COM Report in the Packet

1. Statement of Faith of TE Marilyn Rausch, HR – See Motion #2 in the COM Report in the Packet.

I believe. I have believed since I was a young child. I am fortunate to have been raised by parents who took me to Sunday School and worship every Sunday. My sister and I didn't argue or complain. It was just "what you did" on Sunday morning. I no more questioned it than I questioned getting up on Monday morning and going to school. It was just "what you dd." As a consequence, I have had a firm foundation of faith for my whole life. Like many young adults, when I left my parents' home I quit going to church. At first, it was because I just didn't want to get up on Sunday mornings. I developed a habit of sleeping late and then enjoying the Sunday newspaper with coffee. When I finally did begin attending church again (it's a long story), there was a foundation there. I remembered so many things. It felt much like coming home. My faith has grown and matured over the years, especially as I have preached and taught, especially confirmation classes.

I believe in the Triune God – one God who manifests God's self in the world as Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer, or more traditionally, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The God I know is infinitely loving and merciful. Yes, God gets angry and punishes, but never without good cause.

God the Creator is just that – the author of life – the one who created the world and everything in it. This marvelous work was done in ways unknown to me. Whether it was done in six 24-hour periods, or through the process of evolution, or through a "big bang," it was the work of God and it was good. God continues to be present in and around creation. God cares about the creation and is alive.

God the Redeemer, or God the Son, is God incarnate. It is quite stunning to realize that God chose to come to us in human form. As such, he is Immanuel – "God is with us." Jesus of Nazareth, the Christ, or the anointed one, or the Messiah, is the embodiment of God in human life. As such, we see in him what God is like, and how

God would have us live. I look to the life of Jesus to understand the way I should live. He loved people regardless of their worthiness. He taught. He preached. He healed. He welcomed and associated with all kinds of people, including people who in that day were considered unworthy – tax collectors, prostitutes, lepers, and sinners. He has taught me that I should live that same kind of love and inclusion, even for people my culture considers unworthy. As I seek forgiveness from God, I strive to forgive others who have harmed me.

God the Holy Spirit is the Advocate, the one Jesus promised would come after him to sustain and support us. The Spirit was sent by Jesus to usher in the new life promised. As Paul says, there is new life in Christ, and that's what Jesus promised when he spoke of the coming of the Spirit.

2. Statement of Faith of TE Bryan Bond – See Motion #3 in the COM Report in the Packet.

Without getting too specific or dogmatic, I do believe in every line of the Apostle's Creed. I believe in a God of mercy and love and compassion who came to earth in the form of Jesus, whom to look at is to see God. How do we know what God is like? Look at Jesus, the true Word of God that the Bible points to. 


Rev. Bryan Bond Statement of Faith




