Minutes of the One Hundred Thirty-Ninth Stated Meeting of The Presbytery of Arkansas

October 19-20, 2018

Call to Order/Opening Prayer

The 139th Stated Meeting of the Presbytery of Arkansas was called to order with prayer in the Dining Hall of Ferncliff Camp and Conference Center, Ferndale, Arkansas, by Moderator MWS Leslie Bethell Roper at 6:30 pm on Friday vening, October 19, 2018. Moderator Roper lit the Christ candle and led the presbytery in singing, "This Little Light of Mine," followed by an opening prayer.

Report of Enrollment/Declaration of a Quorum

Temporary Stated Clerk MWS Leslie Smith Belden declared **a quorum present** with 43 Ministers of the Word and Sacrament (MWS), and 78 Ruling Elders (RE), for a grand total of 71 voting commissioners. Also present were 7 corresponding members and 19 visitors. The total number signed in as we meeting opened was 97 representing 33 congregations. The quorum for Stated Meetings of the Presbytery being "20 Ruling Elders and 20 Ministers of the word and Sacrament with at least 20 congregations represented overall" (Policy amended at the 2/10/18 Stated Meeting), a quorum was declared present. The Fuord of total attendance, including those who registered on Saturday forming, is included in the Appendix as Attachment A.

Adoption of the Docket

Temporary Stated Clerk Belden noted additions to the docket as previously circulated and moved the adoption of this new, revised docket. The motion was seconded and the **revised docket adopted**.

Welcome to First-Time Commissioners

Moderator Roper asked first-time commissioners to stand and wave, and the body was pleased to welcome eight first-time commissioners.

Introduction of Presbytery Staff

Moderator Roper introduced the following: General Propyte MWS Stewart Smith; Temporary Stated Clerk MWS Leslie Smith Belden; Director of Mission Support RE Kenneth Rich; Staff for Congregational Discernment MWS Michael Vinson; and Temporary Staff for Youth Hannah Lahorny. Also introduced were RE Bob Boehmler, Presbytery Treasurer; RE David Struklin, Vice-Moderator of Presbytery; and RE Ruth Hamilton, Moderator of the Coordinating Team.

Welcome hown Hosts

Director of Ferncliff Camp and Conference Center Joel Gill welcomed commissioners and guests to Ferncliff, orienting all to the facilities and schedule and expressing his appreciation to the Preobytery for its support and generosity in making possible this new, larger meeting space. Icel also told of a live nativity that will be held at Ferncliff this year, as well as a winter camp. MWS Bill Bailey, pastor of Kirk in the Pines Presbyteriar church of Hot Springs Village, which was the co-host of the meeting, also offered greetings.

Consent Agenda

Temperary tated Clerk Belden then invited MWS Rebecca Spooner to speak regarding the ministry being offered through the Wellspring Renewal Center Contract Covenant Agreement, included in the consent agenda (see below), to active Minister of the Word and Sacrament members of presbytery, Commissioned Ruling Elders, Certified Christian Educators and Associate Certified Christian Educators, Presbytery staff members (Stated Clerk, Director of Mission Support and Staff Associate for Youth) and their immediate family members.

Temporary Stated Clerk Belden **moved he adoption of the consent agenda.** The **motion was seconded and adopted.**

Report of the Treasurer

Presbytery treasurer RE Bob Boehmler reported on the financial reports included in the supplemental packet of the Presbytery's website, and included in the Appendix as Attachment E. Givin, special thanks to Kenneth Rich for his good work preparing the financial information, we expressed gratitude to congregations of the Presbytery for their support of the presbytery's budget and ministry.

Boehmler noted that the total year-to-date revenues as of September 30, 2018, were \$429,960 and total expenses \$544,177. He also noted that projections for the rest of the year reflect lower expenses than those originally budgeted at \$781,529. Reports from the Texas Presbyterian Foundation indicated that third quarter returns on investments with them were at 2.8%, with the nine month, year-to-date returns on investments for 2018 at 5.3%.

Again thanking the presbytery for their support, he expressed his hope that fourth quarter receipts toward the budget will again come in generously.

Report of the General Presbyter

General Presbyter MWS Stewart Smith addressed the Presbytery, beginning by welcoming being able to dress casually while meeting at Ferncliff! He extended a special welcome to MWS member of the Presbytery of Arkansas, MWS Joy Carrington, now living in Wilmington, Delaware, where she serves as a chaplain. He also welcomed the Rev. Michael Erwin, former member of presbytery now serving with the Church Campaign Service. And General Presbyter Smith updated those assembled on improvements underway on the Presbytery's website and email system.

General Presbyter Smith also spoke of things he was observing as he moved around the presbytery, visiting with and serving congregations. He explained that more and iger able more congregations are reaching the "tipping point" where they are no to pay a full-time minister. He also noted that this is not unique Pres crians. embrace the but is occurring across Christendom. He challenged the Presbytery to changes that are coming, noting that a group has been appointed to work on next steps to achieve the priorities of the Presbytery, aided by a volunteer consultant, asking how to live into this different landscape that the 21^{st} century represents. Also, Smith called the Presbytery's attention to the report to be presented on Saturday recommending a new Presbytery staff design, printing out that the report presents short descriptions of the recommended ositions, not fleshed out job descriptions.

Noting that he is approaching his third anniversity in his position, Smith observed that his understanding of the life of the Presbytery is very different from that which he had when he was the pastor of a local songregation. A challenge he sees is that the Presbytery's current organizational structure, with appreciation for those who created it to serve those past eras relies on volunteers -- pastors, educators and ruling elders already busy in their own lives -- to do the work of the organization. They find it hard to keep with the actions and decisions that need to be taken and approved. He noted the large number of committees and task forces Presbytery has and the number of perions required to fill all those positions. Since 2005, he observed, the Presidery of Arkansas has moved from 95 congregations to 79 congregations, with 5,000 fewer active members on church rolls. Smith emphasized his belief that the Fresbytery will need to make changes, structurally, in order to charges happening in society. In order to meet those changes and addre nges, le said, all will need to give permission to be more nimble, more flexible. chal with each other, helping each other, he challenged, will make the changes Worki necessary to faithfully continue to make the Body of Christ visible within and beyond the boundaries of the presbytery.

Introduction of Guests

Moderator Roper then welcomed Board of Pensions Regional Representative MWS Kevin Keaton who addressed the presbytery concerning recent changes to the plan of the Board of Pensions for ministers and church professionals. He also spoke of a new program of the Board of Pensions called "Pathways to Renewal" that brings young ministers into the Benefits Plan with the full benefits of Pastor's Participation at substantially reduced dues. It is designed to provide the hope of renewed leadership to small congregations, and nourishment to innovative ministries.

Moderator Roper then introduced Synod of the Sun Executive Director RE Valerie Young who brought greetings from the Synod and its presbyteries. Mrs. Young noted with appreciation Emily Laurel's work with the Synod's scholarship program and celebrated that MWS Elizabeth Gabbard, of the Presbytery of Arkansas, is soon to be installed as Moderator of the Synod.

Moderator Roper then welcomed MWS Rose Niles from Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary. MWS Niles brought greetings from the Seminary and its president, the Rev. Dr. Ted Wardlaw, noting that there are now five international students at the seminary. She also highlighted service to the PC(USA) rejected in the work of professors such as the Rev. Dr. Cynthia Rigby, whose new volume, *Holding Faith: A Practical Introduction to Christian Doctrine*, was published this last spring by Abingdon Press.

Report of the Temporary Stated Clerk

Temporary Stated Clerk MWS Leslie Belden called the probytery's attention to the fact that First Presbyterian Church of Berryville, now closed, continues to live on through donations made by that congregation to the Arkansas Community Foundation, grants from which continue in Beryville, various ministries initiated by the congregation prior to its closure. Loaves and Fishes Food Bank of the Ozarks and Project Self Esteem of Carroll Loavety each received a check for \$1,162.80. Temporary Stated Clerk Belden then called attention to her report in the Main Packet, asking presbyters to read the updates on the seven existing Administrative Commissions, including:

Cane Hill/Walpatterove Administrative Commission – MWS Phil Butin, Moderator

The Walnus Grove property was sold for \$45,000 on July 15, 2017. The pursbycery received \$19,787 at the closing of the sale and received another \$25,000 before July 14, 2018. The Presbytery pproved the sale of the Cane Hill Presbyterian Church building to the Historic Cane Hill Society at the June 2, 2018 meeting, so that the building could be restored and the church continue meeting there.

First, Clarksville Administrative Commission – RE Ted Belden and MWS Clare Kelley, Co-Moderators

The AC is charged with working with the session of First Presbyterian Church, Clarksville, with the primary responsibility of selling the property, as that congregation meets at the University of the Ozarks' chapel. A motion from the Administrative Commission to the Coordinating Team to approve a \$7,500 loan was referred to the Administration Ministry Area.



Northwest Arkansas Hispanic Ministry Administrative Commission – MWS Phil Butin, Moderator

The ministry is in conversation about potential pastoral leadership.

First, Little Rock Administrative Commission – RE Cyril Hollingsworth, Moderator

The AC works closely with the session and RE Stephen Moody as he provides pastoral leadership.

First, Lonoke Administrative Commission – MWS Lindy Vogado, Moderator

The AC was established June 4, 2016 to assist the section in discerning the next steps for the congregation.

Pine Bluff (Central, Faith, and First Presbyterian Churches) WWS Frank LeBlanc, Moderator

The AC was established at the October 6-7, 2017 meeting for the purpose of assisting the Presbyterian Churches in Pine Bluff, as the presence of the Presbytery of Arkansas, as they look toward their future ministry.

Washington County Property Administrative Commission – RE Ted Belden, Moderator

The AC is charged with selling a property on Crossover Road in Fayetteville valued at \$500,000.

Belden also reported that two additional congregations have had their records reviewed since the posting of the Main Packet, so that the list now includes:

Belden reported that the Presbytery of Arkansas' minutes of 2017 meetings, indexed, with a list of former moderators and PJC members, and all five sections of the Presbytery of Arkansas' Ministry Manual were sent to the Synod of the Sun for review, together with their review sheet with page numbers of where items required by the *Book of Order* may be found. She informed the body that the Presbytery of Arkansas will be cited with at least two exceptions: (1) insurance was not reviewed in the year 2017; and (2) no financial review was reported for 2016 because 2015 and 2016 were not reported until June of 2018. The Synod has communicated that their review of records will be complete by the first week in November of this year.

Temporary Stated Clerk Belden shared that the records of dissolved congregations, and congregations which no longer exist for which the Presbytery has four ecords, were sent to the Presbyterian Historical Society in Philadelphia. A list of those records is found in the Appendix as Attachment F.

Belden announced that, in accordance with *Book of Order* D 10.0103, the Office of the Stated Clerk must report to the Presbytery of Arkansaschat in offense has been alleged and an Investigating Committee appointed.

Report of the Coordinating yeam

Coordinating Team Moderator RE Ruth Hamilton gave the report, moving the following:

Motion that the Presbytery of Arkansas discuss the Woodlands Presbyterian Church of Hot Springs Village, Arkansas, from the PC(USA) in order to be received by the Evangelical Presbyterian Church, subject to the receipt of \$30,000 within ten days of the vote of the Presbytery of Arkansas, and that the Temporary Stated Clerk be authorized to sign such documents and take such action as necessary to effectuate the dismissal and conclude the litigation between the Presbytery of Arkansas and Woodlands Presbyterian Church.

The motion was approved

General Presevter Stewart Smith then offered a prayer on behalf of the Woodlands Presbyterian Church and the Presbytery of Arkansas, as both move from the past into the future. Coordinating Team Moderator Hamilton expressed on behalf of her home congregation the Kirk in the Pines of Hot Springs Village, their best wishes to neighboring Woodlands Presbyterian Church.

RE Hamilton then moved that the following be elected to serve on the Committee on Nominations:

Moderator Roper called for nominations from the floor. There being none, the motion was approved.

RE Hamilton then moved that the Presbytery of Arkansas ratify the following people elected by the Coordinating Team:

Moderator Roper called for nominations from the floor. There by g none, the motion was approved.

It was then moved that "Ministry to the Most Vulne able in our Society" be the Presbytery of Arkansas' Unified Mission Emphasis for 2019-2021; and that the Presbytery's 25% of the 2018 Peace & Global Witness Offering be designated to "Hub of Hope," a northwest Arkansas-based program that works with victims of human-trafficking, human-slavery and immigration Asues. The motion was approved.

Coordinating Team Moderator Hamilton shared the following information with the Presbytery:

A leadership team of the Coordinating Team made up of CT Moderator Ruth Hamilton, Presbytery Moderator Leslie Roper, and Presbytery Vice Moderator David Stricklin, staffed by General Presbyter Stewart Smith and Temporary Stated Clerk Leslie Belden, will move forward according to the parameters of the Coordinating Team's discussion to achieve measurable results toward the approved priorities of the presbytery, working with RE Tom Verdery of the Administration Ministry Area, to gather the leaders as prescribed. The plan was that that leadership form would chose representatives from each ministry area, plus one each from the COI and CPM, and announce this "next step" to the Presbytery at the October 19-20, 2018, meeting, with the hope of reporting back at the March 1-2, 2019 meeting of the resbytery of Arkansas.

This plan Notice in a "Group of 12," with incoming Vice Moderator of the Presbytery, Marion Humphrey, making up the twelfth member of the group. Coordinating Team Moderator Hamilton listed the members of the "Group of 12," including:

It was noted that as this "Group of 12" does its work, the entire presbytery will be invited to participate via a poll that will be distributed presbytery-wide.

Bruce Reyes-Chow will lead the Theological Discussion at the March 1-2, 2019 meeting of the presbytery at the University of the Ozarks, as well as lead a pre-presbytery workshop.

The Coordinating Team had referred to the Administration Miniatry Arts a motion from the Administrative Commission working with First Presbyterian Church, Clarksville, requesting, "that the Presbytery use church development funds to ban First Presbyterian Church of Clarksville up to \$7,500 per year for expenses for the unoccupied building of First Presbyterian Church, Clarksville, with the loan to be pair back from proceeds from the sale of the building when that occurs."

The Coordinating Team gave First Presbyterian Church, Dardanelle, permission to list for sale a piece of property that was deeded to them to a former, now deceased, member.

The Coordinating Team gave Westminster Presbyterian Church, Little Rock, permission to sell their current property on which their church building had burned in July 2018.

The Coordinating Team officially appointed the elected commissioners and the young adult advisory delegate to the General Assembly in June of 2018 to serve as the Presbytery of Arkansas' Polity Committee, their term to last until the PC(USA) General Assembly meets in 2020. Those members are:

The Coordinating Team approved increasing the maximum amount charged for lunch at meetings of the Presbytery from \$8 to \$10.

Support of travel for those from the Presbytery of Arkansas going on youth-oriented summer trips in 2019 at the June 8, 2019 meeting.

The Coordinating Team approved that the summer meeting for 2019 will be held June 8, 2019, at Second Presbyterian Church, Little Rock.

The Coordinating Team granted the Youth Advisory Team permission to clebrate the Lord's Supper/Communion at Junior High Youthquake on September 31 2010 and at Senior High Youthquake on March 31, 2019, both to be at Ferncliff Camp and Conference Center.

Recess for Worship with the Lord's Suppe

Moderator Roper recessed the meeting in preparation for Worship with the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper to begin at 8:00 pm. Following worship the presbytery enjoyed a reception hosted by members of Kirk in the Pines. The worship fulled in in included in the Appendix as Attachment G.

Saturday, October 20, 2018

Re-Convene with Worship

Prior to convening the morning session, an 3:30 am morning prayer service at the cross by the Ferncliff lake, adjacent to the Brown Centry, was led by MWS Anne Russ with music provided by MWS Bill Seitz.

Opening with prayer and again leading the presbytery in singing "This Little Light of Mine," Moderator Roper reconvened the meeting on Saturday morning, October 20, 2018, at 9:00 am in the Dining Hall. She we somed everyone and announced that the offering from last evening's worship service unefitting Solar under the Sun totaled \$1,047.

Those assembled then joined in a morning worship service, in which RE David Clark was commissioned as the commissioned Ruling Elder for First Presbyterian Church, Heber Springs, and RE commissioned as a Commissioned Ruling Elder to serve as Parish Associate at the Presbyterian Church of Bella Vista. Prayers were led by RE Beth Highsman, David's mother, and MWS Dennis Ritchie, pastor of the Presbyterian Church of Bella Vista. MVVS Bill Seitz accompanied the hymn on the guitar.

Temporary Stated Clerk Leslie Belden reminded the body of the proper ways of making motions, speaking to those motions, etc.

Report of the Administration Ministry Area

Moderator Roper invited RE Jan Enke, Moderator of the Administration Ministry Area, to give their report.

Enke thanked the ministry areas, committees, subcommittees, commissions, and their moderators and members, for their 2019 budget requests and reported that, based on requests submitted, the 2019 asking budget is \$14,000+ over projected income. She noted that the primary increase is a proposed additional \$20,000 in funding for the Youth, Young Adult, and Campus Ministry Area, budgeted to work on meeting the goals of one of the three priorities of the Presbytery.

She also noted that the General Assembly's per capita was raised for 2019, resulting in a \$4,500 increase in that line item in the Presbytery's budget. In light of this increase, Enke urged Sessions to make their active rolls more accurate, so that the Presbytery'ill not pay the per capita for persons who are no longer active in the church.

Enke reiterated the three priorities of the Presbytery, affirmed at the June 2, 2016 meeting:

- Building strong congregations that faithfully and effectively share the gospel through mission and ministry;
- Connecting congregations, resources and expertise to appoint life giving practices in congregations and fellowships;
- Developing and supporting ministries with youth and young adults including collegiate and campus ministry.

Enke explained that after discussion, which considered the interest income/spend rate of investments with the Texas Presbyterian Foundation and the existing surplus, the Administration Ministry Area approved designating \$14,300.00 of the surplus from 2017 to be used to balance the proposed budget for 2019. The draft of the 2019 Proposed Budget is included in the Appendix as Attachment H.

The Administration Ministry Area's report reflected that General Presbyter Stewart Smith and Temporary Stated Clern Leslie Belden were reviewed in their roles as elected presbytery staff, as annually required by the Synod, through conference calls with Catherine Allsbury and Ian Leke. Tom Verdery and Steve Hancock have been asked to develop a long-term plan revin-depth and cursory reviews.



Report of the Subcommittee on Honduras Ministry

In the absence of Chris Williams, MWS Leslie Belder reported on the recent ministry trip to Honduras, which included representatives of the Presbytery of Arkansas, and invited the Presbytery to read the reports included in their packets. MWS Belden shared with the presbytery how MWS David Gill had submitted a grant request from the PC(USA) Presbyterian Women's Birthday Offering that resulted in a \$100,000 grant serving the Presbyterian Women of Honduras.

Presbytery Reconvenes

Moderator Roper called the meeting back to order and asked Vice-Moderator RE David Stricklin to assume the duces of moderating the meeting while she gave the report of the Presbytery's Task Force in Staff Structure.

Deport of the Presbytery's Task Force on Staff Structure

Task Force Molerator MWS Leslie Roper invited fellow Task Force member RE Julie Adkisson 6 First Presbyterian Church, Conway, to join her along with General Presbyter Stewart Smith, the staff liaison. MWS Kelly Pearson, an additional member of the Task Force, was unable to be at the meeting due to illness. Roper thanked MWS David Dyer, HR, originally a member of the Task Force who resigned this summer, for his good work with the group. She then explained the history of the Task Force, and called attention to the report of the Task Force included in the packet, which is included in the Appendix as Attachment O.

MWS Roper explained the Task Force's understanding of their task was not to evaluate the current staffing plan or those holding those positions, but rather to discern the staffing

pattern that would best enable the presbytery, within the resources available, to fulfill its role in the years ahead. Those were the Task Force's hopes and prayers for the future, she emphasized. There is no perfect plan, she underlined, reminding that the Presbytery of Arkansas is really all of us -- congregations, Ruling Elders, and Ministers of the Word and Sacrament – not just the staff.

The Task Force's plan recommended a full-time General Presbyter and five part-time positions: Part-Time Stated Clerk, Part-Time Presbytery Administrator, Part-Time Presbytery Builder, Part-Time Presbytery Connector, Part-Time Presbytery Developer of Ministries to, for, and with Young People.

Questions about the plan were asked and answered by members of the Task Force.

A motion was then made by RE Jim Gilbreath of First Presbyterian Church, Springdale, and seconded, that the recommendations of the Task Force on Staff Structure be approved. Discussion of the motion ensued. The motion was approved.

MWS Maggie Alsup moved that the current Stated Verk Search Committee be dissolved and that the Coordinating Team be tasked with the responsibility of appointing a Search Committee with the responsibility of recommending persons to serve in each of the positions in the new suffing structure, as well as that of the position of Stated Clerk.

The motion was seconded, and discussion of the motion ensued. The motion was approved.

Call to Fin Out Evaluation Forms

Thanking Vice-Moderator Struklin for his leadership, MWS Roper returned to her role as Presbytery Moderator, parsing to allow tellers to distribute evaluation forms to the body and asking those attending be meeting to please fill out a form before the end of the meeting. Forms were conceted and a basket placed in a prominent place pointed out for those who completed the orm as the meeting was ending.

MWS Blacke Brinegar moved that the Task Force on Staff Structure be dissolved, with appreciation. The motion was seconded and approved.

Report of the Youth, Young Adult, and Campus Ministry Area

Moderator Roper called the attention of the body to the report of the Youth, Young Adult, and Campus Ministry Area included in the main packet, stating that they had no additional verbal report.

Report of the Committee on Preparation for Ministry

Moderator MWS Jeff Price began his report underlining the responsibility of presbytery to keep in touch with individuals who are in the process of candidacy, offering support and encouragement, and also encouraging congregations whose membership includes persons in the process of candidacy to stay in touch with those individuals offering support and encouragement.

Moderator MWS Jeff Price invited Inquirer LaWanda Harris to join him at the front of the room, and **moved**, **on behalf of the Committee on Preparation for Ministry**, **that LaWanda Harris be examined for candidacy by the Presbytery of Arkansas. Motion approved.** Her Statement of Faith is in the Appendix labeled Attachment P.

RE Harris then answered questions from the floor pertaining to her Statement of Fath.

Moderator Price then moved that RE Harris be moved from the statut of Inquirer to that of Candidate for the Ministry. The motion was seconded. LE Harris left the room. **The motion was approved unanimously**. RE Harris was then brought back into the meeting with a standing ovation.

RE Harris' pastor, MWS Ruskin Falls of Pulaski Heights Fresbyterian Church, was invited to come and assist with a service recognizing RE Harris as Candidate for the Ministry of the Presbyterian Church (USA). Members of the Pulaski Teights congregation present in support of RE Harris were recognized.

Moderator Roper then led the service compissioning RE Harris as a Candidate for the Ministry, assisted by MWS Falls who led the prosbytery in prayer for RE Harris' ministry.

New Business - Report of the Presbytery's Commissioner to Synod of the Sun

MWS Elizabeth Gabbard reported enthusiastically on the upcoming events of the Synod, including her upcoming installation as Synod of the Sun Moderator. She especially invited any who might be able to attend the upcoming Imagine event for which openings still exist.



Wellspring Renewal Center and Rev. Rebecca M. Spooner LPC PLLC covenants/contracts with the Committee on Ministry of the Presbytery of Arkansas to provide the following services from January 1, 2019 to December 31, 2019:

- Six free sessions of either psychological counseling or spiritual direction for the Presbytery's Active Minister members residing in the Presbytery or contiguous counties to the Presbytery of Arkansas (this does not include retired pastor) unless they are currently serving congregations) Commission of Rubor Elders, Certified/Certified Associate Christian Educators, Presbytery suff members (the Stated Clerk, the Director of Mission Support, and Stafe for Youch), and their immediate family members.
- Counseling includes individual (child, adolescent and adua), family, marital, couples, and pre-marital counseling. It does not include a ter-tour emergency services which Wellspring does not provide to any client.
- Other services for the Minister members covered under this contract include: regular correspondence, emergency pastoral cells when needed, and crisis/conflict consultations.
- Counseling services will be provided by Rev. Rebecca Spooner LPC, and other therapists in the Clergy Counseling Network which is managed by Wellspring Renewal Center.

The Presbytery of Arkansas may initiate action to cancel this contract if it has reason to believe that Wellspring Renewal Center has not fully performed its responsibilities in accordance with this agreement, but only after Rev. Spooner/Wellspring Renewal Center has received 10 calendar days written notice stating the specific problems and suggesting ways in which these problems can be corrected.

Counseling services at Wellspring Renewal Center are provided by Rev. Rebecca Spooner

LPC, PLLC, and other therapists on Wellspring's Clergy Counseling Network. All counselors providing service are licensed by the state board and are bound by the legal and ethical statutes of their profession. They also carry their own professional liability insurance. The Presbytery of Arkansas is not liable for any actions of Wellspring or of Rev. Rebecca Spooner LPC, PLLC, or any therapists in the Counseling Network. All counseling records of Wellspring are confidential and information will only be released to the Presbytery with written consent from the client. Wellspring Renewal Center or any counselor on the Network does not provide letters of reference for Ministers, Commissioned Ruling Elders, Certified Christian Educators or any of its clients.

Counselors may refer clients to another therapist if there is a conflict of in ere n behalf of the client or the counselor, or when the counselor believes it to be the raneutically necessary. The Presbytery of Arkansas, nor its Committee on Ministra shall in any way control either Wellspring Renewal Center, Reverend Spooner on Netwo counselors as they carry out the terms of this agreement. Wellspring Renewa Center and Reverend Spooner are responsible for the performance of the work pursuant to this contract and the selection of the methods used to accomplish the terms of this contract. The Presbytery of Arkansas and its Committee on Ministry are only converned with the results. The Presbytery of Arkansas has no jurisdiction over the actions Wellspring Renewal Center and therefore is not responsible for its methods or outcomes. Rev. Spooner will report to the Committee on Ministry annually and at the request of the committee's moderator.

Attachment C

RE David Clark Statement of Faith

I am a child of the church. I was baptized as a baby and was nurtured in the teachings and discipline of a loving church environment. I never knew life as a small child except as on loved and desired by God as expressed to me through the love of my parents, my grandparents and the members of the congregations of the churches my father served.

I am a Presbyterian by birth, by upbringing, by experience and conviction. While many are concerned about the numerical decline of the church, I am not. My fathered me that Presbyterians have always been much smaller in numbers than all the other. bers of God's family but with an influence disproportionately large in comparison. I believe this to be so because of several reasons, all deeply connected to our faith. First as Presbyterians, our faith demands that we know what we believe and in whom we have the faith. Ours is not a simple mystical experience from outside ourselves but is tha commitment of which Paul speaks when he calls for a living sacrifice through the renewing of our minds. Second, as Presbyterians, our allegiance to Jesus Christ demands that our call to ministry we understand we are called to minister to all of mankind. Je is calls us to feed the hungry body as well as save the lost soul. We are called to hear the sick in body as well as bring healing to the soul. Such a ministry demands that we reach out to those less fortunate than ourselves and to care for a kind of humanity that many of us would prefer to cast away and pretend do not exist. Third, I believe that Presbyter ns are called to be the conscious of the at always a popular one, even with our fellow state and society. Often our message is Presbyterians.

I believe in the Lordship of Jesus Christ over my life and over his church. I believe the Holy Spirit continually leads us ultimately to the will of God. Because we are a church that is 'reformed, always reforming," it is more often through a recognition of our excesses and our shortcomings that we are led to perceive a need for the reformation of the church. I pray that my faith will always keep me aware of my own need for reformation and open to the changes that reformation may bring to the church that I love.

My path to becoming a commissioned Ruling Elder seems obvious in hindsight. After being ordained as a Ruling Elder in Batesville I was called on to fill the pulpit occasionally. That led me to find a the pulpit at Greers Ferry two Sundays a month for the last eleven years. I began the pulpit as stronger and stronger sense that I should be doing more. My life and education in this point have prepared me to serve a congregation more fully than simply filling the pulpit. I believe that is what I am called to do.

Attachment D - RE Ronnie Prevost Statement of Faith

My faith is in an ineffable God Who has chosen to reveal the Divine Self to humankind in terms that we can have at least some understanding and comprehension of God. God is triune, revealed in and through Scripture as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. All three persons are eternally God and all three have been and are active in all God's work from creation through redemption and sanctification and, ultimately, glorification. All these are acts of grace and out of God's love and care for all creation.

Though beyond human understandings of gender, the first person of the triune God has been revealed and described in Scripture both in terms of Father (as is traditionally understood) as well as with feminine imagery.

God the Son became incarnate in Jesus the Christ. Jesus, fully human ye fully God (one of the greatest mysteries), lived and died sinless that sinful humanity might be redeemed. His resurrection on the third day vindicated Him and gives blessed have to all His followers. Jesus' sacrifice and atonement is the greatest expression of God's love and God's grace without which humanity is doomed. Jesus' life, sacrifice and teaching serve as patterns by which those who call Him "Lord" are both called and commanded to live. However, this does not mean that humans can earn salvation, redemption, etc. through works -- even if total obedience were possible. Rather, that is the work of God through grace beyond our comprehension.

God the Holy Spirit has been active throughout eternity and specifically mentioned as the agent of creation. Throughout history the Kelv Spirit has called and empowered people to do God's work -- despite sinful human nature which impacts all people are and all they do. Through grace the Holy Spirit inspired flawed creatures to write and preserve Scripture. Through grace the Holy Spirit calls people to salvation. Through grace – and due to Jesus' atoning death -- the Holy Spirit cleanses and redeems sinful people. Through grace the Holy Spirit cleanses and redeems sinful people. Through grace the Holy Spirit calls people to join in Gel's work on earth and entrusts them with gifts to accomplish that work. Through grace the Holy Spirit sheds light on Scripture – written in vastly different cultures of long age – and guides our interpretation of it and, with God's help, guides and empowers outlives and service in our world and culture(s) today.

The church is the body of Jesus the Christ and the covenant community through which God works and so we broughout the world. The church exists both as local congregations and as the durch universal. The sacraments of and in the church are baptism and communion. They are the "signs and seals" and reminders of Jesus' presence and work. They are symbols of what God has done and promises to do. They call God's covenant people to join in God's work. They reflect our collective and individual spiritual union with God and promote unity within the community of faith. Specifically, baptism is the sign and seal of one's inclusion in both God's grace and the covenant community -- the church. Communion is the table of Jesus the Christ and at which He is spiritually present. Therefore, we invite to Communion all who profess Jesus as Lord. Communion connects Christians of all ages in that we all partake of God's grace. It is a call to unity and genuine communion with each other as – with God's help -- we bear witness in our daily lives "to the saving death of our risen Lord until He comes."







Attachment I - MWS Susan Arnold Statement of Faith

I believe in God the Creator; whom Jesus called Abba/Father, who is intense passion, honesty, truth, wisdom, justice, righteousness, grace, and unimaginable love. I believe in Jesus Christ, the unique son of the living God, who was human and is also divine. This God/man was squeezed into human flesh for a particular period in human history. He accomplished in death what is mystery to me; the forgiveness of human sin and the healing of human brokenness. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the breath and voice of God which sustains the church universal. The Spirit communicates with us constantly in inique and powerful ways; dreams, answered prayer, receiving praise, giving encoursement and direction, revealing call, and administering healing.

I believe we are to live in relationship with God. God desires out happines but is more concerned about our holiness. *1 Peter 1:15-16 "like the Holy One vho called you, be holy yourselves in all your behavior; because it is written, 'YOU SHALL BE HOLY, FOR I AM HOLY.'"* We are to live in relationship with one another, the demonstration of that relationship being the church which is the mystical communion of sants spanning time, space and culture – "the great cloud of witnesses" of Heb. 12:1. Church happens when "two or three believers are gathered together" (Matt 18:20), and when telievers "devote themselves to the apostle's teachings, to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer" (Acts 2:42). God works out the church's purpose through human intritutions. The church's purpose is to continue Jesus' purpose; to seek and save are lost and make whole that which is broken.

I believe in the Word of God in three forms; the Word made flesh in Christ, the written Word of Scripture, and the Word preached. Attachment L - MWS Matt Bussell Statement of Faith

I believe that the Triune God created the world out of nothing. The Father is primarily responsible for the act of creation but the Son and the Holy Spirit also participate. God did not create out of primordial matter or with another being but rather out of nothing. God has the ultimate authority and is the source and sustainer of all things.

Humanity is created in the image of God. We are created good and with freedom. God created us to be in relationship with others and God as a community of mutual love, justice, and peace. Sin tarnishes our ability to live as God created us. When we, individually and as a community, destroy relationships through behaviors such as gread, colfishness, oppression, prejudice, and self-devaluation, we alienate ourselves from each other and God.



Attachment O – Proposed Staff Structure by the Staff Structure Task Force

The proposed staffing structure for the Presbytery includes one (1) full-time position and five (5) part time positions, or parts of positions. The Task Force on Staff Structure felt it important to maintain a full time General Presbyter. With the other positions, the Task Force envisioned that there may be candidates who would feel called to serve a church part-time and supplement that work with a position with the Presbytery. Likewise, the Task Force could also envision an individual who was gifted and felt called to combine two of these positions into a full-time position for the Presbytery. These are the pieces that the Task Force felt need to be covered. How, exactly, these pieces fit together we donot feel capable (or called) to determine.

Full-Time General Presbyter

The job description of the General Presbyter would not charge substantially. The one addition we would suggest is language that, as a member of the Presbytery Staff, s/he would offer support to the Stated Clerk and other members of the Presbytery Staff as appropriate.

Part-Time Stated Clerk

The job description of the Stated Clerk would not change substantially. As with the General Presbyter, we suggest a ditional language that, as a member of the Presbytery Staff, s/he would offer support to the General Presbyter and other members of the Presbytery Staff as appropriate and as directed by the General Presbyter.

Part-Time Presbytery Administrator

This part-time position (a) part of a position) would focus on the administrative requirements of the reganization and the office. In particular, this position would include office hour each week when individuals could, with confidence, make direct contact with someone at the Presbytery Office. This position supports the work of the "SynewTech Guy". If that relationship were to change, additional staffing hours would in newled to coordinate the website and other online presences.

Duces include:

- Maintain Office Hours- Be available during posted weekly hours to answer the phone and the door, providing congregations and pastors in the Presbytery a way to reach a person at the Presbytery Office with confidence.
- Onsite financials and support of Texas Presbyterian Foundation
- Provide support for Presbytery office facilities.
- Provide administrative support (as needed) to the General Presbyter, Stated Clerk, and any other staff/volunteer as directed by the General Presbyter.

Part-Time Presbytery Builder

This part-time position (or part of a position) would focus on the priority "Building strong congregations that faithfully and effectively share the gospel through mission and ministry." The person in this position would NOT be personally responsible for the health of each congregation in our Presbytery, but instead would be responsible for being both a conduit and a coordinator of the Presbytery's mutual support for congregations and leaders.

Duties include:

- Be the first point of contact for congregations in the Presbytery that about have an assigned COM liaison.
- With an eye on our smaller, resource-challenged congregations, provide handson support for congregations seeking pastoral leadership without the ability to call a full-time installed pastor. Within this role, explore and develop outsidethe-box possibilities for shared leadership between congregations and within the Presbytery.
- Create a mechanism for mutual support between congregations in the Presbytery, including the possibility of shepherding relationships between congregations.
- Be an active and visible presence at Presbytery meetings, events, and in congregations, when possible.
- Offer support to the General Presbyter and other members of the Presbytery Staff as appropriate and as directed by the General Presbyter.

Part-Time Presbytery Connector

This part-time position (or part of a position) would focus on the priority "Connecting congrugations resources, and expertise to support life giving practices in congregations and fellowships." This job would embody the connectional nature of our denomination, developing and encouraging connections and sharing resources between congregations, pastoral leaders, session clerks and other congregational volunteers, and the Presbytery Staff itself.

Daties include:

- Presiduate connections between the Presbytery Office and congregation, pastors, and members, including coordinating the content that is communicated via the Presbytery's website, social media platforms, and the newsletter.
- Facilitate connections between congregations/fellowships of the Presbytery, including encouraging engagement with regional neighbors as well as churches with common ministries and missions.
- Organize orientation sessions for pastors and other church leadership as they join the Presbytery.

- Facilitate connections between pastors/congregational leaders in the • Presbytery, nurturing both collegial and personal relationships through inperson gatherings and available technologies.
- Connect pastors and congregations to the resources available in the Presbytery. These resources include, but are not limited to, the human resources we have in the expertise of the members and staff of the Presbytery and physical resources. including those housed in the resource center. In addition to connecting to already available resources, explore and connect with new resources that might bring life to our congregations.
- Presbytery Offer support to the General Presbyter and other members of the Staff as appropriate and as directed by the General Presbyter.

Part-Time Presbytery Developer of Ministries to, for, and with Young Peo

This part-time position (or part of a position) would focus on the priority "Developing and supporting ministries with youth and young adults including collegiate and campus ministry." This job would previde staff support for the current ministries aimed at younger Presbytetian, in addition to visioning and promoting new ministries both within our Presbytery and our local congregations.

Duties include:

- Maintain current duties of "Youth Ministry Coordinator". Serve as staff resource for the Ministries with Youth, Young Adults and Campus • Ministry Area. Within the work of that ministry area, encourage innovative approaches and new ideas to foster engagement of young people (under the age of 35) within our congregations and ministries. Connect those who serve on that ministry team with resources available to the Presbytery. Thoughtfully and imputionally engage the congregations of this Presbytery as an
- advocate for ministries with young people. Make face-to-face visits to active youth minimies in the Presbytery, both sharing information about the opportunities offered by the Presbytery and listening to what youth groups are doing and what they need. As time allows, make connections with campus istrice within the state and congregations who actively support their college students/young adults.
- sep a record of "best practices" seen in congregations in terms of connecting and ministering to/with young people, so that those may be shared with congregations who need a jump-start.
- Offer support to the General Presbyter and other members of the Presbytery Staff as appropriate and as directed by the General Presbyter.
