Minutes of the One Hundred Forty-Fifth Stated Meeting of The Presbytery of Arkansas

October 23-24, 2020

Friday, October 23, 2020

Prelude and Announcements

The 145th Stated Meeting of the Presbytery of Arkansas was the second meeting conducted utilizing Zoom technology. The prelude to the meeting began at 6:00pm on Friday evening, Oct. 23, 2020. Scrolling announcements and instructions regarding the meeting, accompanied by music from Carol Nave and Isaac Thomas of First United Presbyterian Church in Fayetteville were shared. The chat function was active during this time so participants could enjoy virtual fellowship together.

Preliminaries

At 6:15 pm MWS Marion Humphrey, Moderator of the Presbytery of Arkansas, welcomed all to the 145th Stated Meeting of the Presbytery of Arkansas and introduced Vice Moderator RE Julie Gillaspy who explained the technology of Zoom.

MWS Leslie Belden, Stated Clerk of the Presbytery of Arkansas, welcomed Corresponding Members, first-time commissioners, and visitors. First time commissioners included RE Gerri Coleman of First Presbyterian Church in Batesville, RE Linda Freeman of First Presbyterian Church in Bentonville, RE Lisa Higgins of First United Presbyterian Church in Fayetteville, RE Elaine Jones of the Presbyterian Church of Bella Vista, RE George Kuharik of First Presbyterian Church of Prairie Grove, RE Patricia Leitner of Kirk of the Hills Presbyterian Church in Fairfield Bay, RE John Lierly of Park Hill Presbyterian Church in North Little Rock, RE Caroline Smith of First Presbyterian Church in Rogers, and RE Cheryl Wright of First Presbyterian Church in Bentonville. She explained that all who registered would be granted privilege of the floor in the Consent Agenda, and asked all in attendance to fill out the evaluation form that will be sent following the meeting by Vice Moderator Julie Gillaspy, who was serving as the technical host of the meeting.

Stated Clerk Belden then explained that the Consent Agenda contained motions to grant permission for such things as the "Tellers" and the "Leaves of Absence Committee" to be replaced by the zoom technology. She further explained who could vote, and shared that as of 5:30 pm that afternoon registration indicated that there were 165 participants registered for the meeting.

Call to Order, Declaration of a Quorum, and Opening Prayer

The 145th Stated Meeting of the Presbytery of Arkansas was called to order with prayer and the lighting of the Christ candle at 6:30 pm on October 23, 2020, by Moderator MWS Marion

Humphrey, who declared a quorum present. A quorum requires 20 Ruling Elders, 20 Ministers of the Word and Sacrament and at least 20 congregations represented overall (approved February 20, 2018 Stated Meeting. The attendance of those registered is included in the Appendix as Attachment I.

Words of Welcome

MWSs Jan and Phil Butin brought greetings from First United Presbyterian Church, the planned on-site host of the meeting prior to the COVID-19 pandemic resulting in on-line meetings.

Consent Agenda

Stated Clerk MWS Belden moved the adoption of the Consent Agenda, containing the following motions:

- 1. Motion to adopt the docket.
- 2. Motion to approve the minutes of the 144th Stated Meeting of the Presbytery of Arkansas, June 6, 2020, held at Trinity Presbyterian Church of Little Rock through Zoom technology.
- 3. Motion to enroll corresponding members with voice but not vote.
- 4. Motion to grant privilege of the floor (voice) to those persons registered, but without vote.
- 5. Motion for the technology of Zoom Room to count votes, serving as what the Presbytery of Arkansas has historically termed the "Tellers."
- 6. Motion for the Stated Clerk to record those absent and those present and include those names and numbers in the minutes, serving as what the Presbytery of Arkansas has historically termed the "Leaves of Absence Committee."
- 7. Motion from the Committee on Ministry to approve the Clergy Compensation Report, including salary changes of pastors in the Presbytery of Arkansas.

The motion was seconded, and the Consent Agenda was approved. The Clergy Compensation Report is included in the Appendix as Attachment II.

Worship

Worship was hosted by First United Presbyterian Church of Fayetteville with the Rev. Judge Wendell Griffen preaching, and Arkadelphia's Community Enrichment Center was designated as the offering recipient. The worship guide for the service is included in the Appendix as Attachment III. At this point in the meeting there were 113 participants in attendance. The offering totaled \$866.20.

Report of the Committee on Representation

MWS Marie Mainard-O'Connell, Moderator of the Committee on Representation, introduced the video of the Committee on Representation's report. The information shared through that report is included in the Appendix as Attachment III.

Report of the Committee on Nominations

CRE Chuck Olson, Moderator of the Committee on Nominations, explained the work and purpose of that committee and moved that the list of nominees included in the Main Packet of information for the meeting be approved. Moderator MWS Marion Humphrey asked for nominations from the floor, and hearing none, asked commissioners to vote. The motion was approved with 79 yes votes and zero no votes. The list of approved nominees is included in the Appendix as Attachment IV.

Recess

That being all of the business before the presbytery for the evening Moderator Humphrey recessed the meeting until the following morning. He called upon MWS Joy Carrington to close the meeting with prayer, and following the evening prayer the Christ candle was extinguished.

The Zoom function was left on for thirty minutes so that people could continue to chat using the chat function, and microphones were unmuted so that those present could also converse.

Saturday, October 24, 2020

Prelude and Announcements

A prelude by Carol Nave and Isaac Thomas of First United Presbyterian Church began welcoming commissioners back to the meeting at 8:30 am, and announcements scrolled on the screen.

Call Back to Order with Prayer and the Lighting of the Christ Candle

Moderator MWS Marion Humphrey called the 145th Meeting of the Presbytery of Arkansas back to order with the lighting of the Christ candle and asked MWS Susan Gray to open the meeting in prayer.

Stated Clerk Belden reported that registration for this meeting stood at 165 registrants and that there were 113 participants for worship the previous evening. She shared information on how to give to the offering through the Presbytery's website, presbyark.org, or by sending a check to the presbytery office. Belden then explained how those in attendance could abstain.

Celebrations and News of the Presbytery

The Presbytery was entertained and informed through a video featuring MWS Stewart Smith, General Presbyter, as Captain James T. Kirk of the Starship Enterprise, RE Julie Price, Presbytery Connector, as Lt. Nyota Uhura, and MWS Carol Clark, Presbytery Builder, as Scotty from the 1966 version of the TV show Star Trek. Presbytery Connector Price shared information about where to find information through the Facebook page PresbyArk Connect and the Presbytery's website, presbyark.org. Presbytery Builder Clark demonstrated the usefulness of the Presbytery's new MissionInsite tool for congregations. Information on MissionInsite is included in the Appendix as Attachment V. Clark encouraged congregations to be trained on the tool when those training events are scheduled.

RE Ted Belden, Moderator of the Committee on the Future of the Church, shared videos of grant recipients, which was followed by videos from college students sharing what's going on with campus ministries across the Presbytery, and videos on youth activities by the Committee on Youth, Young Adults, and Campus Ministries.

The time at the end of the video reports was 9:23 am and there were 123 participants on the Zoom meeting.

Decisions of the Presbytery

Report of the Coordinating Team

Moderator RE David Stricklin moved that the Presbytery elect the following to serve on the Committee on Nominations for the Class of 2023: MWS David Schaller of Faith Presbyterian Church, Horseshoe Bend; CRE Ed Wilkinson of Good Shepherd Presbyterian Church, Greenwood; and RE Wynona Williams-Bryant of Allison Memorial Presbyterian Church, Little Rock. Presbytery Moderator Humphrey asked for nominations from the floor, and being none the Presbytery commenced voting. The motion was approved 93 for and no one against. There were 128 in attendance at the time of the vote.

Report of the Committee on Ministry

RE Cyril Hollingsworth, Moderator of the Committee on Ministry, asked for a few moments of silent prayer commemorating the lives of those pastors who had been raised in Christ since the last meeting of the Presbytery, which included:

MWS Alan Ford, HR: May 15, 1940 – July 18, 2020 MWS Jerry Rice, HR: May 25, 1931 – July 29, 2020 MWS Ken Upham, HR: October 8, 1930 – Aug. 26, 2020 MWS David Dyer, HR: July 22, 1948 – August 29, 2020

RE Hollingsworth then moved that the following pastors be granted honorable retirement:

MWS Dennis Ritchie effective June 30, 2020;

MWS Terry Tallent effective July 1, 2020; and MWS Lacy Sellars effective August 31, 2020.

The motion was approved with 96 yes votes and no one voting no. There were 130 participants at the time of the vote.

RE Cyril Hollingsworth then moved to approve the following concerning the worship service to install MWS Sara Anne Berger as Pastor of Grace Presbyterian Church of Little Rock on November 1, 2020 at 3 pm, with the offering recipient to be Ferncliff Camp and Conference Center, and the following to serve on the Administrative Commission to install:

MWS Lindy Vogado to Preach
MWS Marie Mainard-O'Connel to Charge the Pastor
MWS Mike Ulasewich to Charge the Congregation
RE Sam Byer of Second Presbyterian Church of Little Rock
RE Laurine Williams of Grace Presbyterian Church of Little Rock
RE Lawanda Harris of Pulaski Heights Presbyterian Church of Little Rock

Approved with 101 yes votes and no one voting no.

Committee on Ministry Moderator RE Cyril Hollingsworth moved that MWS Jeff Parker be granted early restoration effective October 24, 2020. (The three years of his censure was due to expire February 27, 2021.) Information supporting the motion was available in the main packet, and MWS Kade Curry and RE Charlie Harwell, liaisons to MWS Parker, spoke to the motion. After a period of questions and answers the Presbytery voted. **The motion was approved** 84 in favor of the motion and 19 opposed. Stated Clerk Belden then led the Presbytery in prayer.

Report of the Committee on Preparation for Ministry

Committee Moderator MWS Susan Gray moved that Inquirer Jeannie Corbitt of First Presbyterian Church in Conway be enrolled as a Candidate for Minister of the Word and Sacrament. Inquirer Corbitt answered questions from the floor on her faith statement, which is found in the Appendix as Attachment VI. Inquirer Corbitt and her mother, Peg Falls-Corbitt were put in the Zoom waiting room for the vote. The motion was approved with 108 yes votes and no one voting no. Members of Jeannie's family and members of First Presbyterian Church of Conway were recognized, and her uncle, MWS Ruskin Falls, prayed on her behalf. There were 132 participants at this point in the meeting.

Moderator Gray then moved that Laura Thompson, a member of First Presbyterian Church in Rogers, be enrolled as an Inquirer. Laura addressed the Presbytery and was then put in the Zoom waiting room while the Presbytery voted. **The motion was approved** with 105 yes votes and no one voting no, and the congregation of First Presbyterian Church

of Rogers was recognized. RE Barbara Records Allen of First Presbyterian Church of Rogers led the Presbytery in prayer on behalf of new Inquirer Laura Thompson.

Report of the Committee on Administration

Moderator RE Tom Verdery explained the 2021 budget for the Presbytery of Arkansas and invited Treasurer Bob Boehmler and Presbytery Administrator Kim Palmer to present and answer questions on the financial statements. Those statements are included in the Appendix as Attachment VII.

General Assembly Commissioner's Report

MWSs Ruskin Falls and Marie Mainard-O'Connell spoke about the difficulties of meeting via zoom this past summer at the PC(USA)'s General Assembly at the same time that they applauded the efforts of the PC(USA) in being able to meet at all. Difficulties included putting off all business concerning social justice issues; the lack of the ability to have robust conversation in the midst of adhering to Roberts Rules of Order; the disparity between the liberality of the General Assembly and the Presbyteries and congregations, which are increasingly more conservative as the body is more local; etc. It was noted that technology is a tool that has assisted the church during the season of COVID-19, providing the means through which to meet and access for those who might not be able to meet otherwise, but that ways of encouraging conversation need to be incorporated. Ruskin and Marie encouraged the Presbytery to consider how the PC(USA) and the Presbytery of Arkansas will proceed into the future in terms of combining the best of in-person gatherings and technology benefits.

There were 130 participants at this point in the meeting, which was 11:30 am.

Order of the Day - Theological Discussion

Judge and Rev. Wendell Griffen, the Division 5 judge of the Sixth Circuit for Pulaski County, and pastor of New Millinium Church in Little Rock, inspired the Presbytery with his insight into the kairos moment we are in, using Star Trek as the tool through which to look at our culture, with Gene Roddenberry's vision of inclusivity as the lens. Discussion centered on prophetic ministry, racism, homophobia, and the current climate in which meaningful, respectful, dialogue is discouraged. The need for white pastors to challenge congregations, and to be prepared to suffer on behalf of the gospel, was stressed in the question and answer period.

There were 127 participants as the business of the meeting resumed at 12:37 pm.

Report of the Stated Clerk

MWS Leslie Belden encouraged those present to please fill out the evaluation form that was to be emailed to the address at which each person registered for the meeting.

Report of the General Presbyter

MWS Stewart Smith thanked staff and encouraged members of congregations to support their pastors who have worked so hard to keep the worship and ministry of congregations going during this season of COVID-19. He also noted that the Governor had asked for our prayers for the state on Sunday, October 25, and that request was posted on the Presbytery's Facebook page. He then introduced a video of pastors, chaplains, Ruling Elders, and members of congregations bringing greetings from across the Presbytery.

There were 122 participants at this point in the meeting.

Expression of Thanks

Stated Clerk Leslie Belden thanked Moderator Humphrey for his excellent moderatorial skills, and gave a special shout-out to Vice Moderator RE Julie Gillaspy and to Director of Youth and Young Adults Brianne Christiansen who coordinated audio and visuals for the meeting. Also thanks were expressed to MWS Jeff Price and RE Jared Brown of Trinity Presbyterian Church in Little Rock and Christopher Verdery and Randy Werner of First United Presbyterian Church in Fayetteville for their work preparing videos, and to Carol Nave and Isaac Thomas of First United Presbyterian Church in Fayetteville who provided music for the introduction and worship, as well as all who contributed to the worship service. Special thanks was expressed to the meeting's speaker Judge Rev. Wendell Griffen, and to Moderator Humphrey for arranging for him to speak.

Closing Prayer and Adjournment

Moderator Humphrey asked for MWS John Arnold to conclude the meeting with prayer and give the closing benediction. Moderator Humphrey then extinguished the Christ candle and adjourned the meeting. The chat function and Zoom meeting were left on for thirty minutes following adjournment so that fellowship could continue. There were 113 participants at adjournment.

Attachment III - Committee on Representation Report

The heart of our purpose as a committee is to enable justice in our presbytery and churches. We are not simply a committee that meets to assemble statistics and make unreasonable recommendations. Our existence is a statement of our collective willingness to press for change, to demonstrate the unfolding Kingdom of God, and point the way where we need specific improvement. Thank you for trusting us to say something true and valuable. As such, we offer these specific recommendations:

- i) We offer to the Nominating Committee a brief analysis of presbytery efforts at diverse committee representation over three years, with full trust that this committee is already well aware of the challenges of finding diverse representation for all committees (see attached). We acknowledge the risk of overusing specific gifted persons of color to the point of burnout. Still, we would highlight these needs for the future:
 - (1) The Committee on Ministry is the largest committee at 22 persons and to our knowledge has not had a person of color since 1988, and we would strongly recommend attention to this need given the size and importance of this committee to individual churches and ministers.
 - (2) The Committee on Preparation for Ministry does not have a person of color, which is of concern as it oversees the preparation of ministry for persons of color, whose lived experience is not reflected among those charged with assisting them on their journey into ministry. We recommend attention to this committee over others to address this current need.

Beyond these two recommendations directly to the Nominating Committee, we offer these three recommendations to the Presbytery as a whole:

- ii) First, we encourage churches to realize the unrecognized gifts that COVID-19, forced change, and technology have given us to use a wider array of people for leadership in the church and Presbytery. Thanks to Zoom and digital meetings, newer, busier, younger persons are available to meet without the burden of travel time and costs; older and more experienced persons are able to participate despite the need to quarantine. We urge you to change how you plan meetings, inviting people into leadership despite the traditional limitations of health and travel schedules, and encourage folks to say yes based on their passions and desire to help the larger church. If you aren't using digital meetings, please consider how this technology may be used in the future. Increased internet access for all Arkansans is an issue of justice that we encourage the Presbytery to consider and act upon.
- iii) Second, we note that our method of collecting statistics is outdated, inaccurate, incomplete, and likely structurally racist. The current system is over-reliant on clerks of session and their pastors to guess at personal information such as race, age, gender, and disability, thus opening the data to errors of omission and assumption. We do not collect

any data on sexual orientation or gender expression, nor keep accurate count of "friends of the church" who have not fully joined us in formal membership. We recommend an overhaul of our statistical methodology to use digital individual survey methods, as well as reconsidering an overture to General Assembly include Friends of the Church in our statistics. At present we lack the ability to accurately represent the life of the church, or hold attention to their vitality.

iv) Finally, our strongest recommendation is very specific and concrete: we recommend every church in our Presbytery become a Matthew 25 Church in the coming year. We challenge each church to examine why they would NOT become a Matthew 25 Initiative institution, as each of the three foci enable brave conversations about race and justice in the church, as well as our vitality. We argue that what really matters—our committee's purpose and the future of our Presbytery-- is vital churches, reflected in the leadership at every level, which can only be driven from within healthy congregations. We cannot force justice from the top down, and so we lift up the Matthew 25 Initiative as a means of developing justice and vitality from within each congregation, holistically.

Report of the Committee on Administration

For Information

- 1. The Presbytery of Arkansas is now fully staffed and focused on supporting the needs of the churches and its members. The Committee on Administration is responsible for supporting our staff and finances for the Presbytery of Arkansas and our denomination.
- 2. We are optimistic that our revenue or our contributions will be on or close to what we budgeted for 2020. While year to date mission support appears below average, it is because much of our benevolence revenue comes in at the end of the year from several churches. In addition, our monthly benevolence reporting is one month behind due to delays from TPF accounting. We continue to be grateful to all our congregations supporting our Presbytery during these uncertain times. We also anticipate our expenses to be lower in some areas due to the Covid-19 pandemic.
- 3. To help support our congregations during this difficult financial year, the Presbytery of Arkansas has extended their Short-Term Operating Assistance Program through **December 31, 2020**. Any church who is interested in a 0% interest rate loan, please contact the Presbytery office to receive further details on this program.
- 4. We have completed a full financial audit for calendar year 2019 and received a "clean audit" opinion from the Landmark Accounting firm. Special thanks to Kim Palmer (Financial Administrator) and Bob Boehmler (Treasurer) for their leadership and support with Landmark.
- 5. We have prepared a preliminary "asking" budget for 2021, which will be finalized and submitted for approval at our Spring 2021 Presbytery meeting (see summary in packet). Key elements of our preliminary budget are:
 - Essentially a 'flat" budget from 2020
 - All committee and ministry budgets will remain the same as 2020
 - The increase in the staff salary amount is due to being fully staffed for 12 months, Last year's budget had two months of partial staff salary.
 - There are no planned staff salary increases for 2021, although we will review all staff compensations during the summer.
 - Presbytery Office increases were due to the upgrade in our database system.

Report of the Committee on the Mission of the Church

Members of Mission of the Church for 2020 are: the Rev. Jan Butin (First United, Fayetteville), Mrs. Kristi Button (First United, Fayetteville), the Rev. Dr. Paul Fulks (First, Van Buren), the Rev. Dr. Gordon Garlington, the Rev. Ainsley Herrick, Dr. Bruce Johnston (First, Batesville), Mrs. Emily Laurel (First, Benton), Dr. Sally Roden (First, Conway), and Ms. Vicky Rogerson (First, Springdale). Staff resources are Julie Price, Presbytery Connector, and the Rev. Stewart Smith, General Presbyter.

Since the June Presbytery meeting, the Committee met via Zoom July 17 and October 2, 2020.

Prior to our October meeting, Joel Gill of Ferncliff Camp and Conference Center told of Ferncliff's plans to create and distribute "Advent in A Box" kits for use during the Advent season. The project was received enthusiastically and the Committee approved up to \$5,000 from our budget to enable Ferncliff to offer a subsidy of \$25 toward the cost per box for congregations, individuals, or families requesting it.

At our October 2 meeting, Julie Price and Stewart Smith told of a retreat -- "Restoring Your Soul: Discovering Healing, Grace and Renewal through Reflection, Relaxation and Reconnection" – to be offered at Ferncliff for pastors and Commissioned Ruling Elders. Led by Presbytery staff and member of Presbytery and Licensed Professional Counselor, the Rev. Rebecca Spooner, the socially distanced retreat recognizes the stress church leaders have been under with the COVID-19 pandemic and it is hoped to be a time of physical and spiritual renewal. Our Committee approved up to \$5,000 to provide subsidies to help Commissioned Ruling Elders and pastors attend.

Commissioned Ruling Elder Mary Shaw was elected to serve as our Committee's representative on the Coordinating Council for 2021.

Our Committee laments the COVID-19 pandemic has caused both our annual PLACE leadership training event and our first ever "Presbyterian Week of Caring, Connecting and Celebrating," originally set for September 27-October 4, 2020, to be postponed. It is our hope that as soon as such events may safely be resumed we will move forward enthusiastically with both.

A portion of our budget comes under the rubric of our Presbytery's "Unified Mission Emphasis," and for the last three years the emphasis has been "ministry to the most vulnerable." During 2020 we are pleased on Presbytery's behalf to have provided grants to assist the ministry of First Presbyterian Church of Huntsville in providing food and hygiene items for needy area residents, to help Graham Memorial Presbyterian Church of Forrest City

purchase a commercial dishwasher to assist with their active soup kitchen ministry, and to help with First Presbyterian Church of McGehee's "Food for Kids" backpack program.

Funds are still available for such grants in 2020. At our October 2nd meeting, it was also discussed that such grants may be made to congregations to assist with pandemic-related supplies – hand sanitizing and cleaning supplies, thermometers, etc. – needed for their operation during this time of pandemic.
